INDONESIA | Christian Governor On Trial

Today 50,000 people are expected to turn out to a rally in Jakarta, protesting against Christian governor Basuki "Ahok" Tjahaja Purnama. It is alleged he made comments defaming the Quran. The claims against him have come as he is running for re-election. Ahok has been outspoken on several issues, including the demolition of religious buildings and the requirement of Hijabs to be worn in schools.

GOD AT WORK

Throughout the process Ahok has stood firm in his faith. He has expressed regret for saying anything that may have caused offence, and a willingness to comply with whatever ruling is made. Ahok's actions are a positive demonstration of faith in Indonesia. It is also encouraging that a Christian could rise to such a prominent position in an Islamic country.
