





# **EGYPT | LIFE FOR CHRISTIANS DURING RAMADAN**

An Open Doors partner in Egypt shared how life can be hard for Christians during the month of Ramadan. He said:

"Some Christians may face physical violence due to the fact that they were caught eating lunch by their fasting Muslim co-workers or neighbours. I remember as a young boy having to eat and drink in the school toilet to avoid troubles with Muslim class mates and teachers."

"Fanatic Muslims turn to the Christians around them and bombard them with intimidating questions about Christian faith to kill the hard fasting hours—and plant doubt in the hearts of Christians."

# **GOD AT WORK**

Ramadan starts this Friday night, the 26 June. Each year many Muslims see Jesus in dreams or visions. God is moving even during the largest Muslim festival of the year.

"Our hearts are crying loud to the Lord that He may show Himself clearly to the millions of Muslims who seek genuinely to find Him," our partner shared. "We also pray that the Lord may use every one of us to act as a light... Please
