





EASTER | Joy in suffering

Victory! While at this point of the Easter weekend we are reminded of Christ's sacrifice, we know what is to come. From the perspective of a persecuted believer, it is the victory over sin and death that brings hope in times of trial. Jesus said, "If the world hates you, keep in mind that it hated me first" (John15:18).

In Indonesia, Darwin* gladly endures persecution to share the gospel. On the 1st of March, Darwin returned to a village to baptise a man who had responded to his preaching. However, a crowd armed with machetes came to stop him. When he was brought before the village chief and local clerics, he simply started preaching again, seizing the opportunity to share the good news. After the crowd began to beat him, a policeman stepped in and arrested him, but as he had done nothing wrong he was released a few days later without charge.

It is the understanding of what Jesus accomplished on the cross that gives persecuted Christians joy in their sufferings. It is the joy that makes them endure to become more Christ-like. It is the joy that Paul speaks about in Philippians 3. It is the joy only found in Jesus Christ.
