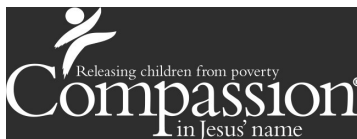

PAKISTAN | Helping Victims of the Lahore Explosion

"...everyone thought with all the church services for the day having concluded without incident, they could rest and not worry," our ministry partner in Pakistan told us, after the explosion that killed 74 on Easter Sunday in Lahore. Our contact recounted her own memories of playing in Gulshan-e-Iqbal Park as a child. She told us the park is frequented by Christians for family time after Sunday services. The group who claimed responsibility for the attack went to the park for this reason and said in a statement they were targeting Christians. [Read more on our blog.](#)
