From the Pastors Desk:

Playing in the park with the kids, I couldn't help but notice how disconnected many of the parents were to their children at play. Either on their phones or media device, reading a book or newspaper or just sitting with coffee in hand staring off into the distance. None of these activities were bad but I couldn't help wondering if this is what they do at a park, how connected were they in their homes? As I've sat with youth around my dinner table, many of them show an awkwardness because of the close proximity of people and conversations. When I've sat in coffee shops, kids, youths and adults alike can be seen sitting across the table from one another busily engaged in social media on their phones. All this caused me stop and wonder what part this lack of personal interaction has in the subtle slide of morality, loneliness and uncertainty felt in our culture today. If the wise are to teach the immature how life is to be lived, disconnection removes a great tool of learning necessary for people to grow into maturity. This begs the question then; how is the church meant to respond to this disconnectedness? To be certain, I'm all for technology, I only just spoke face to face with my brother and his family in Canada this week. I also think time out for parents is required, along with keeping up on the news. I'm also aware that workaholic parents are just as disconnected from their kids, that it's not just a disengagement caused by social media. I also don't think there's a simple solution, but here's what I do think. Jesus hung out with people. He ate, sat, walked and talked with people. In fact His life brought Him ridicule because of who and how He spent time with people. In an age where isolation causes despondency and disconnectedness results in immaturity and uncertainty. followers are called to be Jesus' hands and feet to a disconnected world. The church has the awesome mission of connecting people with the family of God and God Himself. Therefore, how am I connecting with people, is a question we all need to ask? Better still. How are we connecting with our community as a church? 



RUSSIA | Is persecution returning for Russian Christians?

A new law will come into effect on 20 July, described to parliament as an anti-terrorism law. In reality, it's a series of measures that will limit individual freedoms to an extent not seen since the communist era.

No longer will Christians be allowed to evangelise outside of churches, hold prayer events, or legally have house churches. In addition, missionaries will be restricted to working for registered organisations with correct documentation.

GOD AT WORK

Christians in Russia have previously endured heavy persecution, but the church remains. An Open Doors expert for the region said, "[we are] not surprised about the move of Russia, we saw it already happening in Central Asian countries. We want to look with eyes of faith and with hands of prayer to this new situation in Russia... God is building His church in Russia and Central Asia. Is anything too hard for the Lord?"
